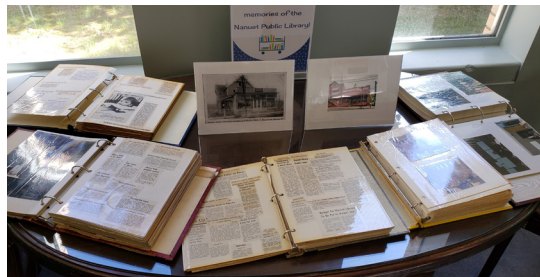

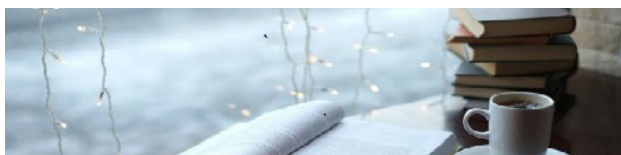

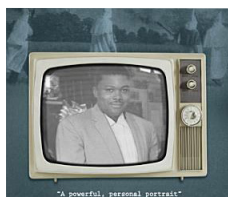
MONKEY BUSINESS: THE ADVENTURES OF CURIOUS GEORGE'S CREATORS.
